Regular Monthly Meeting Report - May 2024

DEI Mission: Sterling Montessori values diversity, prioritizes equity, and commits to being an inclusive school community which is critical to meeting our Montessori mission and affirming the full humanity of all community members. (<u>Our DEI Pledge</u>)

Committee Actions and Recommendations:

- "Suicide is rising as a leading cause of death for children and adolescents. According to
 the North Carolina State Center for Health Statistics, the rate of youth suicide in North
 Carolina has nearly doubled over the previous decade." <u>NCIOM</u> The board should
 consider the addition of questions that measure our student's mental wellness as part of
 routine surveys.
- The board should consider that "most elementary and secondary schools in the United States provide inadequate mental health supports, despite the reality that the number of students in need of services continues to outpace available resources (Foster, Rollefson, Doksum, Noonan, & Robinson, 2005)." <u>School Mental Health Initiative</u>
- The board should review data and policy to ensure alignment with State Board of Education approved professional standards for school counselors. <u>N.C. G.S. 115C-316</u> states that "School counselors shall implement a comprehensive developmental school counseling program in their schools. Counselors shall spend at least eighty percent (80%) of their work time providing direct services to students."

Updates from Executive Director

Group Activity Highlights

Student Mental Wellness



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- Discussion on the prevalence of mental health concerns in the classroom
- How does anxiety and depression show up at Sterling? Explore ways to identify, prevent and intervene (when appropriate)

Mental Health Statistics & Resources

- Untreated mental health issues can lead to decreased academic performance (NIH-National Institute of Mental Health)
- In 2021, about 1 in 5 North Carolina adolescents seriously considered attempting suicide, and 1 in 10 made an attempt <u>NC School Behavioral Health Action Plan</u>
- 80% of children who need mental health services do not receive them, primarily due to barriers such as lack of access and stigma (Journal of Abnormal Child Psychology)
- <u>Hope4NC</u>, <u>Suicide & Crisis Lifeline</u>, <u>Crisis Solutions North Carolina</u>, <u>Get the SCOOP on</u> <u>Managing Stress</u>, <u>National Alliance on Mental Illness</u>
