Distance Learning

All students are fully remote.

What is Blended Learning?

Class of 28 is split into 2 smaller groups

 Each group will alternate 1 week in-class and 1 week at home with work plans

Week at School: Montessori work cycle

 Week at Home: Follow-up from lessons, daily group lesson/ attendance check, weekly check-in.

Important Points Blended Learning

Changes at School

- No use of microwaves, lockers, cloth placemats
- Face shields worn only with masks
- Face mask protocols
- Bring extra face masks to school
- Individual work rugs
- Sneeze guards
- Playground time (2LE/2 UE out at a time)
- Afternoon temp checks
- Early dismissal on Friday (prepare and clean)
- Health screening during carpool
- Before Care 8AM
- No Aftercare

Important Points Blended Learning

Placement Process in Blended Learning:

- Retain rosters as much as possible
- Balance Classrooms
 - Gender
 - Diversity
 - Individual Needs
 - Siblings on same track
 - Numbers

Our #1 Goal in Blended Learning

Prioritize the health and safety of the Sterling community.

Important Points Distance Learning

- Teachers will be confirmed once we know how many families choose the Distance Learning Option
- Platforms will stay the same
- Montessori Curriculum
- Consistency with community events
- Outcomes the same -distance and blended will need to look differently

Important Points Distance Learning

- Virtual Specials PE, Music, Spanish (4th - 8th)
- Art Resources provided
- Looking at providing more social/collaborative opportunities
- On-going teacher training and oversight
- Always Evolving

TRANSITION CONSIDERATIONS

Preparation is Key Teachers and environments are ready!

- Consistency and predictability
- Realistic expectations
- Providing social /connection opportunities
- Individualizing
- Observations guiding next steps
- Time, patience and understanding
- Additional Resources

How we made our decision?

- Studied NCDHHS recommendations
- Evaluated resources faculty, rooms, resource staff and substitutes
- Budget considerations and purchase of necessary supplies to return safely (shield, signage etc.)
- Administrative team worked with teaching teams to determine next steps.
- Health and safety is our first priority.

Keep in Mind.....

 Our top priority is always going to be the health and welfare of students and staff.

Our goal is to get students back to campus.

Parent Questions:



Why Can't My Child's Placement Stay the Same?

- We need to have balanced classrooms
- Teachers on campus vs. Teachers with accommodations who will need work at home.
- Students whose teachers will be teaching remote need to be placed.

Why pull out the sixth years?

- They need to follow Plan B
- Only in blended learning distance learning will continue to be a mixture.
- Wanted them to be a part of a culture of students where expectations are consistent
- Good opportunity to form community before they move to MS

What will placement look like next fall?

- Goal: Multi-Age classes
- Retain as much of the placement process that we can.
- Minimize any changes

How will we meet the individual needs of students who may be in a new environment?

- January Assessments/ Benchmarking
- Collaboration/Information sharing from teachers during the placement process.
- Lessons are meant as assessments
- Student Goal setting conversations/conferences.
- Conferences with parents
- Virtual Meet and Greet

Can we change tracks after the initial choice is made?

- Families who opt-in to Sterling's Distance Learning Track will be enrolled in the program for the duration of the school year
- Students can not join the in-class Blended Learning Track once enrolled in the Distance Learning Track
- Depending on the number of families choosing Distance Learning, if an extenuating or emergency circumstance arises, it may be possible to switch to distance learning

When will students need to stay home or leave school immediately?

- They have tested positive for COVID-19 and have not met criteria for returning to school;
- They have had close contact with a person with COVID-19 and have not met criteria for returning to school;
- They have a temperature of 100.4°F or higher; or they are experiencing:
 - Fever (100.4° or higher) or chills
 - New cough (unrelated to allergies)
 - New shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
 - New loss of taste or smell

On the blended track - what will the week at home look like?

- Continued use of learning platforms and materials from their kits
- Use of videos for reference
- Join for a daily community meeting/lesson
- Supplementary work or information as needed
- Individualized as much as possible

What is the plan to open school full time for students who need to be in school full time?

- We will re-evaluate in February at the Board Meeting to see if our blended learning track can come daily.
- Other considerations:
 - Health and safety
 - Resources for Sterling (substitutes)

Can a student withdraw, enroll in a different school, and then come back to Sterling without having to go through the lottery?

 If a family chooses to withdraw from Sterling, they will need to go back through the lottery in order to come back to Sterling.
